Sermon: Starts With Water Text: John 2:9 & 10

Thesis: God's Best Is The Best.

I. Jesus Didn't Just Help The Bridegroom Save Face.

A. Imagine The sheepish look on the bride groom's face.

B. Jesus has helped him to put his best foot forward.

II. Jesus Didn't Just Save The Day.

A. Jesus made the day.

B. Jesus makes the worst of days, the best of days.

III. Jesus Does Always Save The Best For Last.

A. This is true, because nothing compares to His best.

B. This is where faith is involved.

Conclusion: There is so much to make note of with this first miracle of Jesus. He did it using the most basic building block in nature. Maybe, because He wanted to show that He didn't need much to work with. In fact, His best work is done ex nihilo. He could have started with grapes and done this miracle. But by starting with water, Jesus showed that with the simplest thing on earth He could turn it into something much more beautiful. Let Jesus bring His best. Believe in His best.
