

Look At Everything Under The Light Of Truth John 3:19 – 21

Thesis: Sins Tries To Camouflage Itself.

I. The Word Of God Exposes Sinfulness As It Is.

A. Sin always has consequences.

B. Sin in all forms is evil.

II. The Word Of God Allows Us To See Things As They Really Are.

A. It would great to allows see things as they truly are.

B. And now His light reveals what a choice to sin really is.

III. Things Aren't As Appealing In The Light Of Truth As They Are In The Dark.

A. Satan is a clever deceiver.

B. Sin is never as appealing when we get the full picture. Conclusion: Sin wears a clever camouflage. Years ago, in warfare the night was a time of suspended action and a time to conceal before starting later. But technology was created to pick up heat signatures which allowed no one to hide. Later night vision came along and added to our ability to own the night. God's Word has allowed us much the same thing. It exposes the plots and motives of the adversary. It allows us to see sin for all it is. Now, trust the light and view everything under truth.

"This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but people loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil. Everyone who does evil hates the light, and will not come into the light for fear that their deeds will be exposed. But whoever lives by the truth comes into the light, so that it may be seen plainly that what they have done has been done in the sight of God." - John 3: 19-21
